Consent Agreement and Liability Release

I, _____, do hereby voluntarily request to be permitted to come upon the property of **DJ Ranch, NE¼ 14-20-2 W5M**, hereinafter referred to as the *Property Owner(s)*, for the purpose of participating in **Spring/Summer Day Camps**.

I am fully aware and understand that horses are unpredictable by nature; that when frightened, angry or under stress, a horse's natural instincts are to jump forward or sideways, to run away from danger at a trot or gallop, to kick, to buck, to rear up in front, or to bite and that horses are extremely powerful. I understand that I could be injured as a result of any of these or other actions of a horse. I understand these risks, and I voluntarily assume these risks and dangers.

I further understand that upon mounting a horse or driving a carriage and/or taking up the reins, the rider/driver is in primary control of the horse, and that the *Property Owner(s)* are not responsible for the results of the rider's/driver's actions or inaction's, or for the actions of the horse, or for faulty equipment. I am aware that the wearing of an approved riding helmet can reduce the chance of injury.

I fully understand and agree that I, alone, am to be responsible for any bodily injury or property which I should sustain on the grounds of the *Property Owner(s)* while engaged in general recreation, riding, driving, viewing or caring for a horse, and for any time I should lose from employment or other activity, and for medical expenses or any other expenses incurred because of such bodily injury or property damage.

In acknowledgement of the above, I hereby, for myself and my heirs, HOLD HARMLESS the *Property Owner(s)*, and their respective servants, agents, employees, officers, and all other participants of and from all claims, demands, actions and causes of action for such injuries sustained to my person or property whether or not such injury or property damage resulted from the negligence or gross negligence of the *Property Owner(s)*, or their servants, agents, employees or officers, or resulted from any defect in tack or equipment that might be used on or around the property.

I understand and agree that, in exchange for being permitted to participate in general recreational activities and/or the boarding, viewing, caring for, riding or driving of horses on the property of the *Property Owner(s)*, I am voluntarily assuming the risks of any injury or property damage that might occur for ANY REASON and acknowledge my agreement that I may not bring a lawsuit or a claim of any kind against the *Property Owner(s)*, their servants, agents, employees or officers for such injuries and/or property damage. If I should bring such claim or lawsuit in violation of this agreement, I agree that I shall be liable to the *Property Owner(s)* for any and all reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses that may be incurred by the *Property Owner(s)* in defending against such claims.

I further agree to indemnify and reimburse the *Property Owner(s)*, their servants, agents, employees or officers for any injury and/or property damage to any third person as a result of any action or inaction on my part. This indemnification includes the reasonable cost of attorneys' fees and expenses incurred by the *Property Owner(s)* in defending against any such suit.

I understand and agree that this Agreement and Liability Release is being entered into in the Province of Alberta and the laws of the Province of Alberta shall govern its terms and conditions. The parties agree that if any term or condition is found to be invalid under the laws of Alberta, such offending term or condition shall be stricken from the agreement without affecting the other terms and conditions.

Terms, Policies & Requirements

Terms

Policies

All students must wear protective headgear while working with the horses, whether on the ground or on horse back.

Rooted In Respect For Self And Others

The conduct of Students and Staff is important for a fun and safe experience for all. Thus, everyone is expected to contribute to an atmosphere of friendship, kindness, patience and respect at all times. Those who become disruptive or seriously diminish the camp experience of another will be sent home. Expulsion can be for reasons of violence, theft, possessing illegal substance or weapons, for intentionally damaging property, refusing to obey Staff or the use of inappropriate language or content. For reasons of safety, Students must stay within the Fort boundaries unless accompanied by a Staff member.

Requirements

Students should be sure to have the following with them each day: (Please make sure that all belongings are clearly marked with the students name)

Jeans

Shorts

Swim Suit & Towel (for sprinkler activities)

A light, short sleeve shirt

A long sleeve sweater

A jacket (preferably water proof)

Footwear suitable for riding (something with a small heel)

Hat for shade

Riding Helmet (mandatory, a bike helmet works well too)

Sunscreen

Refillable water bottle

Lunch, Snacks and beverages (Bottled water will be available at all times free of charge.)

The following items are NOT allowed on the premises:

Knives, matches, fireworks or weapons. Illegal substances will be confiscated and given to legal authorities. In order to preserve a "back to nature experience" and to promote socialization, we do not allow radios, CDs, tape players, or electronic games.

GENERAL RULES

No Dogs! No Guns!

No Stallions! No Drugs or Alcohol!

No smoking except in designated areas.

No yelling, running, loud noises, sudden movements, jumping etc.

Parents are responsible for all minor children.

Any concerns with a child are to be taken up with the child's parent – not the child.

Always handle a horse gently, while discipline is necessary, physical ABUSE of any horse will not be tolerated.

All equipment, including grooming tools, are to be put away after use and not left lying around.

All gates shall be kept shut at all times (except when passing through).

Absolutely no dumping anything on premises, except in designated area.

Tie areas shall be kept clean. Be considerate, if you or your horse(s) make a mess, clean it up.

Tie areas shall be occupied only as necessary.

Helmets MUST be worn in the barn at all times.

Helmets must be on before you approach any horse.

Speak clearly in a normal voice.

Speak before approaching.

Speak when handling.

Speak before touching.

Speak before you move.

Speak before leading a horse through or by people.

Speak, Speak, Speak to your horse.

Always approach a horse at the shoulder.

Hold your arm and hand out for him to sniff. The correct way is to make your hand and arm look like the horses head and mouth.

Your hand should be palm down and fingers curved.

Scratch the horses shoulder with your right hand.

Never wrap a lead line or reins around your wrist or body.

Never walk under a horses neck or the tie line - he can't see you and could be frightened when you disappear on one side and pop up on the other.

When moving from one side of a horse to the other side always keep a hand on his rump and stay close to the horse.

When turning a horse loose into a pasture, pen or stall always turn the horse to the door or gate, which should be closed, before you take the halter off.

Please obey the on-site speed limit of 15Klm per hour.
